<b>Scope and Content:</b>	The collection consists of two digitized scrapbooks that focus on Coleman's years at Garner High School (1968-1972) and at North Carolina Central University (1972-1976). There is also a folder of biographical news clippings about E'Vonne Coleman dating from 1992 to 2014 and a folder of publicity materials and programs for performances that Coleman was involved in.

<b>Note:</b>	E'Vonne Coleman is a Garner, North Carolina native. She attended Garner High School, where she was very active in the drama department and performed in several plays. She went on to get her B.A. with honors in dramatic arts from North Carolina Central University and has a Master of Arts from the American University in Washington, D.C. From 1985 to 1991, she served as assistant director of the Expansion Arts Program at the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA) and in 1991-1992 she was special assistant to the chairman of the NEA. In 1992, she was appointed executive director of the Durham Arts Council, the first black woman to hold the position, which she served in until 2001. In 2001, she became an associate director of the Office of Continuing Studies at Duke, working on professional certificates and youth programs throughout North Carolina. In 2009 she was appointed vice-president of the Durham Convention and Visitor's Bureau and as of 2014, served as the Chief Operating Officer at the DCVB.
