Abstract:	<p>The Stephen M. Cruse Papers contain materials relating to local history and development projects in Durham and historic preservation resources, photographic material, and architectural drawings and maps. Most of the collection documents Cruse's role as the planner in charge of the Durham Historic Preservation Commission (HPC), a quasi-judicial body of nine appointees, which holds public hearings to determine whether requested changes to the exterior of historic district or local landmark properties are appropriate by state law, local ordinance, and historic preservation plans for the districts. Materials from the HPC include correspondence, meeting minutes, rosters, certificates of appropriateness, National Register applications, and property surveys.</p>	
	<p>The Stephen M. Cruse Papers are divided into four series: General Files, Durham Historic Preservation Commission Files, Photographic Materials, and Oversized Materials.</p> <p>The General Files series ranges in date from 1977 to 2009 and includes some undated material. The series contains resource materials on the operation of local historic commissions in the state of North Carolina; resources on historic preservation published by national and federal organizations such as the National Park Service, the National Trust for Historic Preservation, and Brandywine</p>	

Scope and Content:

Conservancy; materials relating to various development projects in Durham including the redesign of the 15-501 corridor and the construction of Durham Central Park. The series also contains material relating to local history, clippings, newsletters, and assorted print material.

The Durham Historic Preservation Commission Files range in date from 1972 to 2010. They document Cruse's role and activities as Durham City/County Planning Department liaison to the commission and are divided into three subseries: Administrative Files; Districts, Places, and Landmarks; and Property Surveys.

The Administrative Files contains meeting minutes and notes; commission rosters and appointments; materials relating to grant opportunities; city contracts; and applications for certificates of appropriateness. This series also contains meeting minutes, notes, and reports from DHPC's predecessor, the Historic District Commission (HDC).

The Districts, Places, and Landmarks Subseries contains mostly applications for National Register recognition. Applications include histories, overviews of function and architectural styles, and some photographs. In some cases the materials include neighborhood petitions and preservation plans.

The Property Surveys subseries contains general survey reports as well as reports that formed the basis of two publications on local historic architecture, The Durham Architectural and Historic Inventory (1982) and Durham County Architectural Inventory. Most of the material in the series was the product of two architectural surveys funded by the Durham City/County Planning Department and the North Carolina Division of Archives and History: a county survey conducted by Marion O'Keefe and Jane Sheffield in 1987-88 and a survey of the extraterritorial planning area that straddles the city-county boundary, conducted by Ruth Little in 1989-90. The general surveys include drafts of Ruth Little's multiple property documentation form that outlines the historical contexts of the city's development and associated domestic architectural styles. It also includes sections on farmstead, church, school, and mill architecture styles. This subseries also contains a few historic American building survey sheets that include descriptions of property location and photographs. The Durham Architectural and Historic Inventory materials contain detailed data sheets compiled by Claudia Roberts that document architectural style, structural dimensions, types of building materials, porch and addition details, and significant persons or events associated with individual properties. A section on neighborhoods includes photographs of properties, narrative histories of the neighborhoods, and brief descriptions of the photographed properties. Photographs from the publication can also be found in the Photographs Series. The Durham County Architectural Inventory materials contain research materials compiled for its publication including drafts of chapters and sections, lists of photographs, a property index, and bids for publication. Also present are surveys of individual properties, subdivisions, and neighborhoods, which include brief histories, descriptions of architectural styles, and photographs.

The Oversized Materials Series contains various maps of Durham City and Durham County, noting locations of historic structures and neighborhoods; copies of primarily historic photographs; architect's renderings of various local development projects including 15-501 corridor appearance plans and the proposed regional rail; and two large architectural plans of proposed additions and repairs to historic structures.

The Photographs Series includes photographs, contact sheets, negatives, and slides ranging in date from the 1950s to the 2000s of residential neighborhoods and individual homes; downtown storefronts; industrial, commercial, and civic buildings; and churches and cemeteries. The series also contains additional photographs published in The Durham Architectural and Historic Inventory.

Biographical/Historical Note:	<p>Stephen Cruse graduated from North Carolina State University in 1973 with majors in English and history and in 1978 from the University of Georgia's School of Environmental Design.</p> <p>From 1980 to May 1984 Cruse worked in the North Carolina Historic Preservation Office as manager, then director, of the Stagville Preservation Center, a facility used for teaching historic preservation theory and African-American history. From May 1984 to June 2009 Cruse served as a senior planner with the Durham City-County Planning Department with leadership roles in historic preservation and downtown planning, and small area and comprehensive plan amendments. As the historic preservation planner for the City and County, he was liaison to the Durham Historic Preservation Commission. Associated duties included authoring preservation plans for the city's historic districts, staff reports for cases that were to come before the Commission, and landmark designation reports. Cruse was also active in efforts to revitalize downtown Durham. He chaired the Durham Design Review Team, served on the boards of two non-profits, Downtown Durham Incorporated and Durham Central Park, was active in the creation of the Downtown Master Plan, and served on the Parrish Street Advisory Committee. He also worked closely with various city and private parties on downtown revitalization and development projects, including preliminary designs for the Durham Bulls Athletic Park, the West Village development project, the YMCA, and American Tobacco complex. Cruse also worked with developers interested in renovating existing buildings, ushering their projects through the approval process with the Durham Historic Preservation Commission and the Façade Improvement Program with Downtown Durham Incorporated. Cruse also served three two-year terms on the Raleigh Historic Districts Commission, including two years as the chairman of the Certificate of Appropriateness Committee.</p>
