Biographical/Historical Note:	Lucas Middle School, the first new traditional middle school in Durham since 1988, opened in August of 2012 at 923 Snow Hill Road. It was named after Durham educator John H. Lucas Sr. and Jeanne Hopkins Lucas, the first black woman senator in North Carolina's state senate; its first principal was Thomas Seckler. The school follows a project-based learning model, in which students acquire knowledge and skills by spending an extended time on a real-world problem or challenge.
