Abstract:	
Scope and Content:	The collection primarily documents John Schelp's work in the Old West Durham Neighborhood Association (OWDNA), including agendas and newletters as well as projects taken on by the association. Research files about the neighborhood, buildings, businesses, and people are included as well as personal documents and documents concerning Schelp's work in the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP).

	John Schelp was born July 2, 1961 in Washington, D.C. He received Bachelor's degrees from St. Lawrence University in government and French, worked in the Peace Corps and USAID in the Congo for seven years, and received a master's degree from UNC-Chapel Hill in public administration in 1990. He's worked at the National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences since 1991, where he organizes community forums around the country. He's also served as an elections observer with Jimmy Carter in Liberia.

years. He was president of the Old West Durham Neighborhood Association (OWDNA) from 1998 to 2003 and helped build community in a neighborhood that didn't have a name – identifying, protecting, and advocating for its heritage. He led clean-ups of the Erwin Mills Cemetery, thwarted plans to build asphalt plants in poor Durham neighborhoods, rallied the community to challenge Duke's attempts to expand on-campus retail, stopped a cement plant from being built on the Eno River, prevented digital billboards from being erected along Durham roadways, and influenced business people, developers, and local officials to improve construction plans and regulations.

Schelp and neighbor Pam Spaulding started the OWDNA website, whose history pages were named a "Local Legacy" by the Library of Congress in 2000 and recognized by Preservation Durham with the Pyne Preservation Award. Schelp helped the OWDNA win a Herald Sun Grit Award in 2000, was named "Tarheel of the Week" by the News and Observer in 2002, and won another Grit Award in 2005. He has served as vice-president of People's Alliance, vice-president of the Durham branch of the NAACP, and president of the North Carolina Peace Corps Association.

Schelp now volunteers on the Pauli Murray steering committee, the People's Alliance Fund board, the Museum of Durham History advisory board, and is chair of the Parent Council at UNC-Greensboro.

Organization of Collection:

Materials are organized into subjects or projects and arranged alphabetically. Most subject names were derived from Schelp's original files. Within each topic, papers are ordered chronologically. A few folders contain clippings at the end of the folder (these are often undated and therefore not arranged chronologically). Historical Research, Oral Histories, and School Histories are arranged in original order since these topics primarily consist of reproductions of older materials.
