The American Library Association (ALA) recognizes October 16-22, 2022 as **National Friends of Libraries Week!**

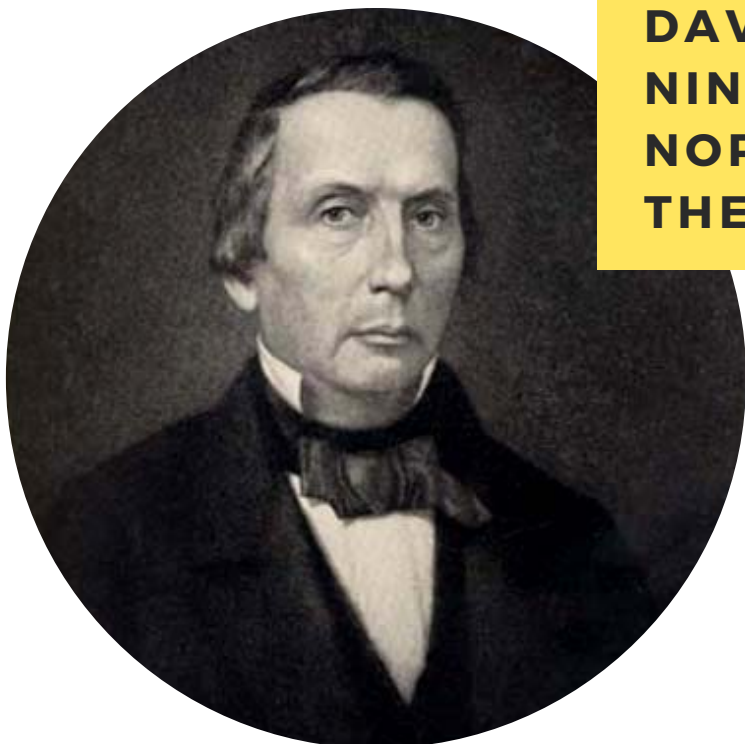

Willis P. Whichard of Chapel Hill is a lawyer who, like his subject David Swain, has spent most of his career in public office and the academy. He is the only person in NC history who has served in both the NC House of Representatives and the NC Senate as well as on both the NC Court of Appeals and the NC Supreme Court. Dean and Professor of Law at Campbell University from 1999-2006, he holds the A.B. and J.D. degrees from the University of Virginia.

Justice Whichard was the Founding President of the Durham Library Foundation and served on its board from 2001-2010. He has been a member of the Durham County Library Board of Trustees since 2018 and is currently its vice-chair.
