Is there life out there beyond Earth's boundaries? Join the Maker + STEAM team to explore 5 drop-in stations about space research on what life beyond Earth might be like if it did exist. In these stations, you can explore the surface of Mars through 3D printed models from images the Viking Orbiters took, research and design an example of what life on Mars might be like if it exists, sort planetary objects in gas giants or rocky planetoids, decorate a 3D printed UFO spinner, and experience visual projection through a Pepper's Ghost experiment. This program is a precursor to the Aliens! It's (almost) Never Aliens! program occurring in the Main Auditorium from 6 - 7:30 p.m.
